An autobiography is an account of someone's own life.

Recounts anecdotes and facts about their past, and hopes for future.

Combines factual information with descriptions.

Broadsheet newspapers: 'quality' or 'serious' press

More text, fewer pictures

Political, economic and more serious news is reported

Tend to be politically biased

Font is smaller and headlines are more factual

Less gossip and more 'real' news

Designed to appeal to more educated readership, requiring a reading age of 15 to fully access all the material



Tabloid newspapers: 'popular' press

Less text, more pictures

Tend to be right or left wing biased

Font is large and headlines are amusing, full of alliteration or outraged in tone

More gossip and less 'real' news

Designed to appeal to range of readers but require a reading age of only 5 to access the text, so mostly aimed at people with lower levels of post-16 education
