# LEARNING





The Clere School is set on a beautiful 20-acre site in the north of rural Hampshire.

Our site provides our students with excellent recreational space, surrounded by trees and plant life at the edge of the picturesque Hampshire village of Burghclere.

Over the past years the school has benefited from classroom refurbishments and upgraded sports facilities. Students enjoy the use of covered walkways, a performance hall with beautiful parquet flooring, landscaped seating areas and a large reception area where we host our annual Art exhibition.

Our extensive playing fields, tennis courts and playgrounds enable us to provide a wide range of sporting and leisure activities. We have a state-of-the-art four court Sports Hall, a Fitness Suite and a large gymnasium for indoor games.

Careers Education and guidance are an important part of every student's educational experience at our school. Careers Education is provided through Unifrog, our online careers platform.

Tutor groups access the platform weekly to complete individual tasks and explore careers options. We offer young people opportunities for mock interviews, careers talks and visits to workplaces. All students receive individualised careers guidance in the form of interviews with a qualified Careers Advisor.

We have strong links with Peter Symonds College in Winchester and Queen Mary's College in Basingstoke. These colleges offer an unrivalled range of post-16 study opportunities and have excellent track records for preparing students for transition into the top universities. Some of our students attend Andover and Sparsholt Colleges and Basingstoke College of Technology for their post-16 study. These colleges offer a more vocational approach, equipping students for a career in their chosen field. Sparsholt, for example, is a renowned agricultural college.

We have a well-established work experience programme that takes place in Year 10. All students participate and have a placement for one week in one of a wide range of local firms and organisations. This is a valuable opportunity that offers insight into the world of work and enables students to develop a more informed picture of possibilities for their future.

# EXTENSION AND ENRICHMENT

At The Clere School we believe that education is an experience. Academic achievement is important, but school is also an opportunity to participate in activities that students may not have otherwise been able to.

These experiences help shape students' personal attributes and develop their confidence. Additionally, they help to give our students a sense of achievement and instill a life-long love for learning and add to their enjoyment of their time with us.

Our enrichment opportunities include:

- ◇ Sporting opportunities are available in netball, football, rugby leagues and dance giving opportunity to apply the skills learnt in lessons and after-school clubs in context. Annual sports trip is also offered to Wembley for international football fixtures.
- ◇ Residential foreign travel trips to enhance learning outside the classroom: these include History visits to Battlefields trip and Ski trip to Andorra. Curriculum Enrichment take place throughout the year such as the National Computing Museum, Geography Field Trips, and trips to the Theatre.
- ◇ Duke of Edinburgh Award: Students can participate in this internationally recognized award scheme to achieve their award.
- ◇ Public concerts and whole school productions – each year students can audition to be part of our public concerts at Christmas and in the summer term. Alongside our concerts is an art exhibition in which students have the opportunity to showcase the artwork produced throughout the year.
- ◇ Music Technology club – for those students interested in music tech, there is a lunchtime club to learn how to use Ableton Live and Sibelius as well as learning how to set up recording equipment. Students can then use these skills within their GCSE performing and composing components.

- ◇ Peripatetic music lessons – We offer lessons on violin, flute and saxophone which is delivered through Hampshire Music Service. Our Jazz band, 'Just On Beat', rehearse every Friday after school and perform at our concerts and other events. Some members of our vocal ensemble were part of the Arts Community Project recording of 'Rather Be' with a number of schools from the Basingstoke and Deane area.
- ◇ Gardening club – we have been developing a garden on the school site next to the tennis courts. This five-year project is supported by the student gardening club with the aim of producing a calming area where students can spend their break and lunchtimes. We now have several vegetable patches and a number of students involved in planting and cultivating the garden regularly.
- ◇ Coding Clubs and Competitions – we have run Scratch Gaming and Raspberry Pi Clubs for those students interested in gaming and learning how to code.





# PASTORAL CARE

At The Clere School we strive to create an outstanding climate for learning. For children to learn

effectively, they must feel happy, supported and cared for. Our Pastoral system provides the support and guidance that students need from Year 7 through to Year 11.

As a smaller secondary school, children do not slip through the net at The Clere. They form strong relationships with their peers and a manageable number of adults. Our personal knowledge of children and their families is of significant benefit to the students in our care.

The goal of the pastoral system is to remove barriers to learning. We believe in a culture of tolerance, respect, and moral purpose in all that we do. The pastoral leaders help children to overcome any difficulties they may be having so that they can continue to learn and make progress.

Each morning, tutors meet their groups for registration. This consistency ensures that students have an adult they can turn to for help at the start of the day. The tutor monitors children's daily well-being and preparedness for learning and is therefore a very important person in their life at school.

All our tutors are supported by our Key Stage Leaders who in turn are supported by our Assistant Headteacher in charge of Welfare and Behaviour. This team is further supplemented by our brilliant and dedicated pastoral team. The role of this wider pastoral team is to support students with advice and guidance, provide first aid, monitor attendance, and give targeted support where required. If it felt that further support is required, this is implemented.

Students are given opportunities to develop as leaders throughout their time at The Clere. They can become student council representatives, prefects, tour guides and sports prefects. Sports prefects, for example, work in the primary schools giving assistance with events such as sports days.

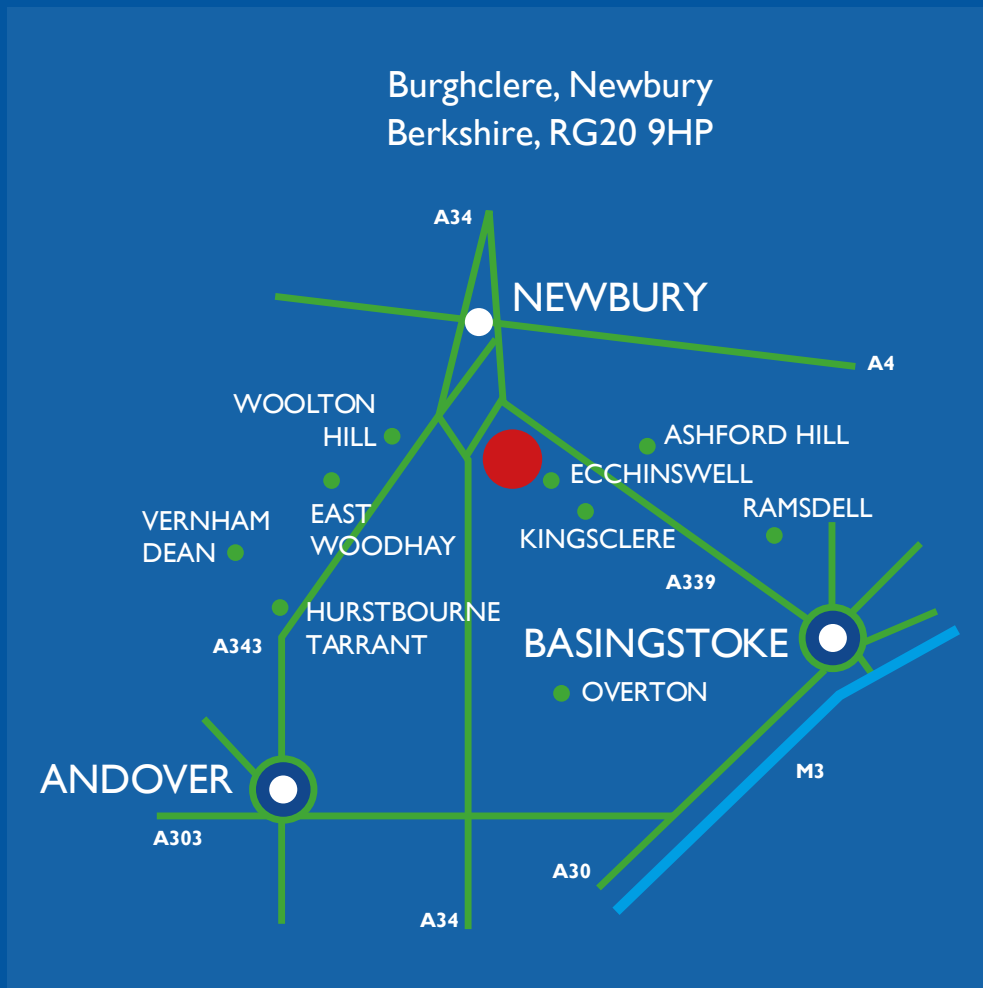
