KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER - 'With a Little Help From My Friends' - Year 9

CHORDS - Keywords & Key Information

- 1. **Primary** I, IV, V
- 2. Secondary ii, iii, vi & vii
- 3. Cadences formed by the 2 chords that come at the end of a musical phrase.
- 4. $\mbox{\it Perfect Cadence}$ uses chords V I at the end of phrase. Sounds like a full stop.
- 5. Plagal Cadence uses chords IV I at the end of phrase. Sounds like A-men.

KEY INFORMATION ABOUT CHORDS in 'With a Little Help From my Friends'

- 6. Many earlier songs by The Beatles use the 3-chord trick (only primary chords)
- 7. Chords ii and vii are introduced in 'With a Little Help From my Friends'
- 8. 7th chords are used Dm7 and G7
- 9. Verse chord progression: I V ii7 V7 I
- 10. **Chorus** chord progression: **bvii IV I**
- 11. **Bridge** chord progression: **vi II I bvii IV**
- 12. Use of **passing notes** in the melodic construction of the **bass line** in the opening bars, results in **inverted chords**.

RHYTHM

- 1. Tempo is *Moderato* 110/112 bpm
- 2. **Shuffle Beat** essentially breaks every crotchet beat into a triplet with the first two tied.
- 3. **Syncopation** off beat.
- 4. **Triplet** 3 quavers played in the time of 2
- 5. *Fill* a short passage of music which helps to bridge the gap between sections: there are *Guitar and Drum fills in the Chorus*.
- 6. In the *Intro*, the rhythm of the **2-bar guitar fill sets the triplet feel** for the rest of the song.
- 7. **Guitar & Piano** play mainly **straight crotchets**.

TIMBRE - Instruments

- 1. VOCALS tell the story; mostly syllabic but use some melisma's
- 2. **PIANO** used to **provide the harmonic structure** of the song and to embellish the accompaniment.
- 3. **GUITAR** lead guitar is the featured guitar, usually plays single-note-based lines and plays **instrumental fill passages**.
- 4. **BASS** primary purpose is to **provide the bass note for each chord** and plays a role in maintaining the beat.
- 5. **DRUMS** the heartbeat of the music; sets up the tempo. The **swinging syncopated rhythm** gives the song a relaxed, lilting feel.
- 6. **OVERDUBBING** new sounds or music are added to the existing recording.

KEY INFORMATION ABOUT INSTRUMENTS in 'With a Little Help From my Friends'

7. Tracks 1 & 2 of the Sgt. Pepper's Album are *cross-faded* with pre-recorded applause to reinforce the idea of a live recording.

STRUCTURE

1. Intro - Verse 1- Chorus - Verse 2 - Chorus - Bridge - Verse 3 - Chorus - Bridge - Chorus

KEY INFORMATION ABOUT STRUCTURE in 'With a Little Help From my Friends'

- 2. Words in **Verse 1** reflect a lack of confidence in himself as a singer; **5-note vocal range**.
- 3. In **Verse 2**, the tone has changed from the insecurity of Verse 1 to questions about personal **loneliness**.
- 4. Chorus 2 adds vocal harmonies and the second part of bar 6 transitions to the Bridge.
- 5. The **Bridge provides a complete contrast** to the Verse/Chorus with use of an expanded vocal range and harmonies.
- 6. Call and Response in the Verses 2, 3 and Bridge

MELODY

- 1. Narrow vocal range Ringo sings only 5 notes.
- 2. *Melisma* a group of notes sung to one syllable of text; sung on 'lone' and 'own'
- 3. **Passing notes** a note between two notes of a chord, e.g. between C and E, D is a passing note.
